## Infants and Toddlers—Early Start

The California Early Start program provides early intervention services for eligible infants and toddlers (birth up to age 3) that have developmental delay, a disability or an established risk condition with a high probability of resulting in a delay. Intervention services are provided according to individual needs and may include:

Child development Therapy; Physical Therapy; Occupational Therapy; Speech Therapy and Behavioral Therapy.
