Many experts believe a key solution for advancing access to healthcare on a continuing basis is the addition of mobile units. Role of Community Health Clinics

According to many estimates, The Affordable Care Act (ACA) will move 32 million Americans into the insured population in this country. How will all those additional people be provided with quality healthcare? Community Health clinics, like MCCN, will be the "front-end" primary care providers and will take in these newly covered patients.

Community Health clinics are integrated into The Affordable Care Act because they are seen as a key component for redesigning American health care delivery to improve quality, lower cost, and expand access to people. Community Health clinics will receive billions in funding to expand services, for operating costs, and for new construction. MCCN has already been awarded grants to make improvements at the main clinic in North Hills and build a new facility a few blocks from that location.

Another key component in providing access to all those newly insured people who need to receive healthcare is to provide mobile services.

MCCN continues to expand its mobile clinic services. The newest unit will serve San Fernando Valley Schools as well as the Community. Funding for this project was made available through the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
